Goals and Objectives for the CCT2008

The emergence of DES has seen percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI) further consolidate its position as the foremost treatment of ischemic heart disease. Patients presenting with "complex lesions" previously contraindicated for PCI had until recently to be sent for bypass surgery, but all that changed with the dawning of the DES age; these difficult lesions are now treated routinely and with considerable success by PCI. The global effect of these new stents is to have both expanded and standardized the indications for PCI.

Taking as its theme, "New Horizons for CTOs", we sought through CCT2006 to place the primary focus on the chronic total occlusion, the most challenging of all lesion subsets. To this end, we are delighted and proud to reflect on the enhanced input the CCT received this year from abroad, which played a large role in ensuring we staged a world-class live demonstration course. This was due in no small part to the efforts we have made to deepen ties with overseas physicians and organizations, especially in Asia. And this year's meeting was not just about CTOs. Plenty of attention was given to identifying optimal strategies for bifurcation lesions and vulnerable plaques, as well as to the other burning issues of the day, and we can be pleased with the quality and standard of the sessions on these topics.

One of the defining features of the CCT is that it finds a place in its programming not just for PCI but also for strategies for heart disease in general and peripheral intervention. The structure of the Peripheral Course had been reviewed and revised since last year, and expanded to make it more global, and over the two days, the course showcased the latest interventional strategies for the brain, the carotid and the leas.

The Surgical Course was not limited to bypass surgery alone, but highlighted the latest developments in surgical therapy and explored how to encourage their wider adoption.

As for the Electrophysiology Course, we feel that this year's lives were of better quality and greater effectiveness than the last year.

These are the building bricks that have enabled the CCT to



grow into the world-class global meeting it is today. The CCT encompasses the whole spectrum of cardiovascular disease (coronary heart disease, peripheral artery disease, arrhythmia, conditions requiring surgery) and presents the latest




treatment strategies for them. As we move forward, we aim to preserve the central importance of our live demonstration courses while continuing to make the meeting bigger and better every year.

Also, we held a very well-received live for co-medical staff, aimed at finessing the skills of our co-medical participants, whose role in medical care is so important, and whose ability to work effectively with the physicians is so vital to the success of that care.


The success of the CCT in recent years - particularly the jewel in its crown, our live demonstration courses - has established it in the top rank of international cardiology meetings alongside the TCT in the US and the PCR in Europe. Since 2005, the official language of the CCT has been English, which has as intended given us that extra edge in positioning ourselves as a world-class live demonstration course, broadcasting to the world in English but from Asia and from an Asian perspective. This innovation undoubtedly played a large part in the 43% increase on the previous year in participants from overseas, this year up to 630, with the accompanying increase in international exchange which everyone benefits from, Also, the increased number of live broadcasts from Asian institutions meant that communication between participants was smoother and more effective, on both sides, and that this helped to provide a better environment for learning for all. We believe that these factors also encourage participants from different fields to encounter. appreciate and benefit from each other's experiences and know-how. On the negative side, we know from last year that for many of our Japanese participants, the switch to English has made it difficult to understand all of the content of the sessions but we tried to overcome this at CCT2006 by laving on simultaneous interpretation into Japanese. This is not a perfect solution for our Japanese attendees but we believe firmly that Japan needs to present itself to the world in a language the world understands - and that language is English. To maintain and consolidate our position as a "leading international live demonstration course" we intend to continue this policy of English as the official language of the meeting.

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Expectations for CCT2008 and a Message to our Supporters

CCT2006 was held over three days from September 21 to 23 at the Kobe International Exhibition Hall and the total attendance of 4,700 constituted a 9.5% increase on the previous year. We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved for all their hard work. With the adoption of English, since 2005, as the meeting's official language, the number of overseas participants has now risen to 630 (a 46% increase on 2005) and we had people attending from 35 different countries. The large increase in attendees from abroad is testimony not just to the fact the CCT's choice of CTOs as the main theme has attracted the attention of the world, but also that we can now boast a truly world-class live demonstration

This year for the first time Kobe International Exhibition Hall's brand new Hall 3 was available to us, and we made full use of this for our various symposia, lectures and industry-sponsored seminars. It seems that everyone appreciated the convenience of having all the venues used for CCT2006 in the same place, but we also received some complaints that the sound quality was not what it could have been. This was largely due to the fact that Hall 3 was experiencing some teething problems, and we sincerely regret any inconvenience caused to

The action-packed program for CCT2006 was a noteworthy for the high quality of the live demonstrations. The Masters Live, mostly dealing with CTO cases, allowed participants to see our Course Directors demonstrating their own skills at the table, along with our guest operator Dr. Kazuaki Mitsudo. The Peripheral Course has now been expanded to a more comprehensive two-day live course, whilst our various new training courses such as the educational sessions (with the Hands-on PCI Training Sessions foremost of those), all innovations this year and involving direct participation by attendees, were all well-supported. We are also happy to report that the luncheon seminars and fireside sessions run by our industry sponsors were for

the most part standing-room only.

We at the CCT remain committed to our long-standing objectives, namely researching, investigating and encouraging the adoption of the latest diagnostic techniques and therapeutic strategies for complex and challenging lesions, while developing and enhancing our status as a live course broadcasting from Japan to the wider world.

We also believe that for our corporate supporters, we offer an excellent return on investment in terms of the promotion of their products by virtue of the attraction to the meeting of experts in not just percutaneous

intervention, but also in arrhythmia and surgery. We are also pleased that the moving of the next CCT meeting to the end of January will mean that more physicians will be able to attend. We look forward to continuing to receive your support and co-operation.
